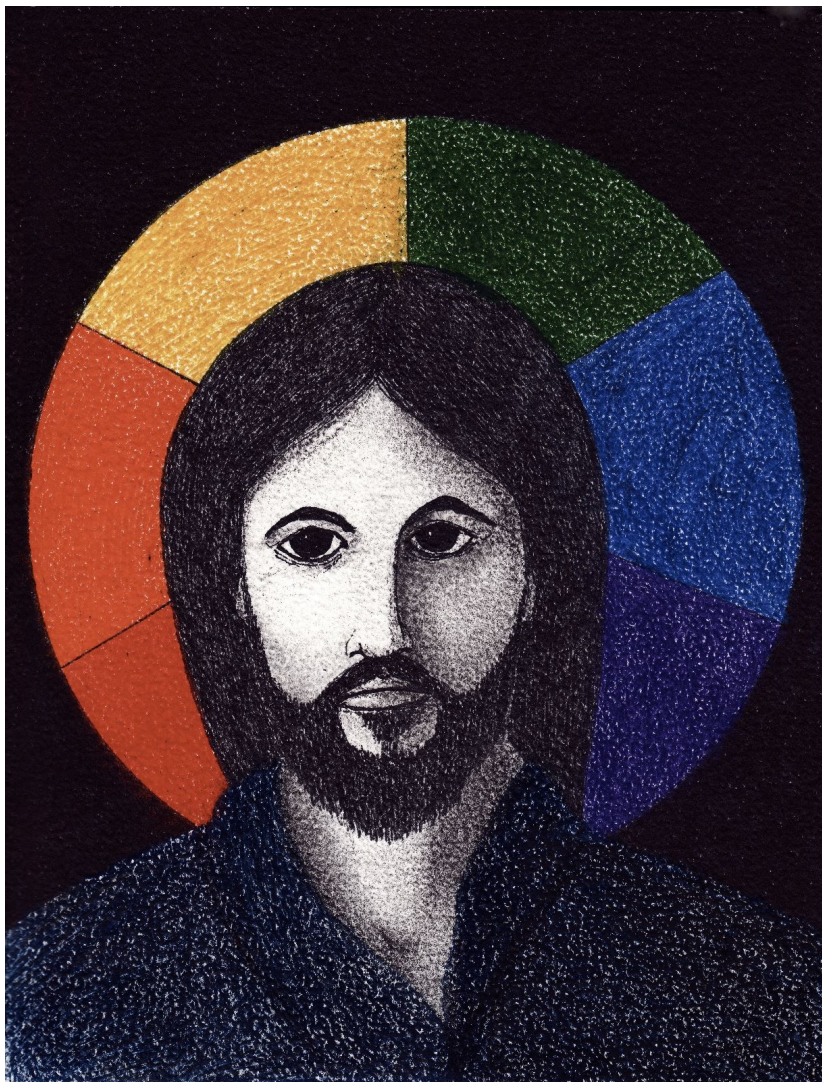

## The Gathering

*Please join in with the words in **Bold type**.  
We stand at the bell for our opening hymn.*

## The Greeting

*Priest*     ✠ In the name of the Father, and of the Son,  
and of the Holy Spirit.

**All**         **Amen.**

*Priest*     The Lord be with you.

**All**         **And also with you.**

*From Easter Day to Pentecost we say*

*Priest*     Alleluia. Christ is risen.

**All**         **He is risen indeed. Alleluia.**

*The priest introduces the service, and invites us to say sorry.*

## Confession and Forgiveness

*We may use this song (to the tune of 'What shall we do with the drunken sailor?') to think about things for which we need to say sorry.*

**I want to say that I am sorry,  
I want to say that I am sorry,  
I want to say that I am sorry,  
Help me dear Lord Jesus.**



*We may use the following form of confession*

*Priest* Lord have mercy.  
**All** Lord, have mercy.

*Priest* Christ, have mercy.  
**All** Christ, have mercy.

*Priest* Lord have mercy.  
**All** Lord have mercy.

*The priest pronounces God's forgiveness ✠ and we respond* Amen.

## The Collect

*The Collect, the prayer for the day, is prayed, and we respond:* Amen.

## The Gloria

*On some days we recall the song of the angels in the* Peruvian Gloria.

*Cantor* Glory to God, glory to God, glory to the Father.  
**All** Glory to God, glory to God, glory to the Father.

*Cantor* To God be glory forever.  
**All** To God be glory forever.

*Cantor* Alleluia, amen.  
**All** Alleluia, amen. Alleluia amen, Alleluia amen.

*Repeat for:*

Glory to God, glory to God, Son of the Father...

Glory to God, glory to God, glory to the Spirit...

## The Liturgy of the Word

*We sit for the First reading. At the end, the reader says*

*Reader* This is the word of the Lord.

*All* Thanks be to God.

## The Gospel

*We stand and turn to face the Gospel Book for the Gospel reading.*

*Priest* The Lord be with you.

*All* And also with you.

*Priest* Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to  
Matthew/Mark/Luke/John.

*All* Glory to you, O Lord.

*At the end of the Gospel reading*

*Priest* This is the Gospel of the Lord.

*All* Praise to you, O Christ.



## Homily

*We sit and listen to a short talk on our readings.*

## The Prayers

*We sit for our Prayer of Intercession. This response may be used*

**All** Lord, in your mercy,  
**Hear our prayer.**

*The prayers may conclude with*

**All** Merciful Father,  
**accept these prayers for the sake of your Son  
our Saviour, Jesus, Christ. Amen.**

## The Peace

*The Priest introduces the Peace.*

**Priest** The peace of the Lord be always with you  
**All** **And also with you.**

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

*We exchange a sign of peace with those around us.*



*We sing a hymn as the altar is prepared, and a collection is taken. If you wish to donate by card or phone there is a contactless giving machine at the back of the church.*

## The Eucharistic (Thanksgiving) Prayer

*Priest* The Lord be with you  
**All** and also with you.

*Priest* Lift up your hearts.  
**All** We lift them to the Lord.

*Priest* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**All** It is right to give thanks and praise.



*The priest praises God for sending Jesus, with a prayer which concludes (to the tune of 'Kum By Yah'):*

**Holy, Holy Lord, Holy God  
All our prayers are joined  
By the Saints  
✠ Blessèd is the one  
Who comes in peace  
Blessèd is the Prince of Peace.**

*The priest recalls Jesus' words and actions at the Last Supper. We acclaim*

*Priest* Jesus Christ has died.  
**All** Jesus Christ has died.

*Priest* Jesus Christ is risen.  
**All** Jesus Christ is risen.

*Priest* Jesus Christ will come again.  
**All** Jesus Christ will come again.

*The priest continues to pray the prayer of thanksgiving, which ends,*

*Priest* For honour and praise belong to you, Father,  
with Jesus your Son, and the Holy Spirit:  
one God, for ever and ever.

**All** Amen.

## The Lord's Prayer

*Priest* Let us pray together the prayer that Jesus taught us.

**All** Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy name;  
thy kingdom come; thy will be done;  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those who trespass against us.  
And lead us not into temptation;  
but deliver us from evil.  
For thine is the kingdom,  
the power and the glory,  
for ever and ever. Amen.

## Breaking of the Bread

*The Priest breaks the bread, saying:*

*Priest* We break this bread  
to share in the body of Christ.

**All** Though we are many, we are one body,  
because we all share in one bread.



## Giving of Communion

*The following prayer may be used to invite us to receive communion*

This is the table, not of the church, but of the Lord. It is made ready for those who love God and for those who want to love God more. So come, you who have much faith and you who have little; You who have been here often and you who have not been here for a long time; You who have tried to follow and you who have failed. Come, because it is the Lord who invites you.

*If you normally receive Holy Communion in your own church, you are welcome to do so here. Please join in with the hymn during communion.*

*After Communion we remain seated to listen to any Notices.*

## The Dismissal

*We stand to receive God's blessing.*

*Priest*      The Lord be with you.  
**All**          And also with you.

*The priest gives God's blessing ✠ to which we respond: Amen.*

*Priest*      Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.  
**All**          In the name of Christ. Amen.

*or, from Easter Day to Pentecost*

*Priest*      Go in the peace of Christ. Alleluia, alleluia  
**All**          Thanks be to God. Alleluia, alleluia

*We sing our final hymn.*

***Please join us for refreshments after the service.***
